

Dear Mr Thapar

Thank you for your e-mail.

The Council as trustee was required by the Commission to give public notice of the draft Scheme on a local noticeboard and in a local newspaper. They will give notice that the Scheme is being made and provide details of how a copy of the draft can be obtained. The public will have 21 days from when the notice is placed to make representations to the Commission. Publicity on our website is in addition to this to make it easier for the public to access a copy of the Scheme itself.

In this case, publicity on our website started when we notified the Council of the procedures for giving public notice. Unfortunately, there have been some delays in arranging publicity in the local newspaper which means that the publicity period on the website did not tie in with that for the newspaper. I will therefore be arranging for the draft Scheme to be placed back on the website so it is available for the 21 days from the date of the newspaper notice, which I understand will be this week.

None of the representations on the Scheme that we have received will be considered until the end of the notice period, 21 days after the newspaper notice.
